**Sub:-** Application dated 28.04.2017 of the President, Sri Adichunchanagari Shikshana Trust, Sri Adichunchanagari Kshetra, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District- 571811, Karnataka to establish a new Ayurveda College in the name of “Adichunchanagari Ayurvedic Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Survey No.- 112, Nagaruru, Dasanapura Hobli, Nelamangala, Bengaluru North- 562123, Karnataka ” with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course, under Section 13A of the IMCC ACT, 1970 from the academic session 2018-19-  
**Conditional Permission Letter -reg.**

Sir,

In continuation to CCIM's letter of even no. dated 31.01.2018, wherein a Letter of Intent (LOI) was issued to you to establish a new Ayurveda college in the name of **Adichunchanagari Ayurvedic Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Survey No.- 112, Nagaruru, Dasanapura Hobli, Nelamangala, Bengaluru North- 562123, Karnataka** with **100 seats in UG (BAMS) course** from the academic session 2018-19 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 22-23.05.2018 to assess the available facilities of teaching and practical training for conducting UG course and to verify the compliance submitted by the applicant during the LOI period and shortcomings as communicated in LOI and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same, it was observed that the required number of patients, OPD Departments, functional labour room in respect of deliveries, college website, Web based computerized central registration system, Functional Operation Theatre, Kshara Sutra, X-ray, ECG and USG and Aadhaar based geo location enabled attendance system as per RMS, 2016 were not available. Therefore, under provisions of the first proviso to sub-section (5) of Section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on 17.08.2018 to present the case.

3. The observation of hearing Committee based on submission made by the college representatives during hearing and recommendations & visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC

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Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder, and as per approved standard Operative Procedures (SOPs), it is found that College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting conditional letter of permission for UG (BAMS) course with **100 seats in UG (BAMS) course** from the academic session 2018-19 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

4. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to **grant conditional letter of permission to President, Sri Adichunchanagari Shikshana Trust, Sri Adichunchanagari Kshetra, Nagamangala Taluk, Mandya District- 571811, Karnataka** to establish a new Ayurveda College in the name of **“Adichunchanagari Ayurvedic Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Survey No.- 112, Nagaruru, Dasanapura Hobli, Nelamangala, Bengaluru North-562123, Karnataka”** with **100 seats in UG (BAMS) course** from the academic session 2018-19 under section 13A of the IMCC Act, 1970, subject to the condition that the college shall fulfill the following requirements by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2018:

- i. Functional Labour room in terms of deliveries.
  - ii. Functional X-Ray, ECG and USG.
  - iii. Functional Web based computerized central registration system for OPD and IPD patients.
  - iv. Functional Aadhaar based Geo location enabled attendance system for teaching staff, non-teaching staff, and hospital staff.
5. In addition, following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2018 to get conditional permission for the session 2019-20:
- (i) All the requirements under relevant provisions of the Minimum Standards Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 and Regulation 10 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2018 to get conditional permission for the session 2019-20;
  - (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda); and
  - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*.

6. The college administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the relevant CCIM Regulations, are in position before the admission of the first batch of students in the 1<sup>st</sup> professional of BAMS course is made, under intimation to the Central Government and CCIM.

7. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for II<sup>nd</sup>, III<sup>rd</sup> and IV<sup>th</sup> professionals well in time as per the CCIM norms which will be verified and reported by the CCIM at least three months before the start of next professional and accordingly, the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be issued.

8. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 14(2) of the IMCC Act, 1970 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
